Question 1

The excerpts below present contexts where same sex marriages are officially recognised (South Africa) or outlawed (Eswatini and Uganda). The glaring similarities amongst these three countries is that the Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, Queer and Intersex (LGBTQI) community faces numerous challenges regardless of whether they are recognised or not. In about 300 - 400 words ($1\frac{1}{2} - 2$ pages), discuss these challenges as presented in both legal and illegal instances. Suggest ways in which the Kingdom of Eswatini could accommodate all citizens irrespective of their sexual orientation.

Excerpt 1

The LGBT Heroes Fighting to Hold the First Ever Pride in Eswatini By Tim Teeman: Adapted from *The Daily Beast* (April 04, 2018)

LGBT activists in Swaziland are planning to hold the country's inaugural Pride march and festival in June, and they hope it will help change anti-gay laws, hearts, and minds. In the last week of June, LGBT activists in Swaziland hope to make history by holding the African country's first ever Pride march and festival. Advocacy group, The Rock of Hope, told The Daily Beast it is in the process of submitting an application to march and then hold a picnic or gathering in a park in the city of Mbabane.

In Eswatini, homosexuality is described as "an abnormality, satanic, and a sickness." Male homosexuality is outlawed in the southern African country. LGBT couples cannot marry or adopt children, and there are no LGBT bars or LGBT-specific gathering places in the country. The June event would be the first time for LGBT people to gather en masse. An anti-sodomy law is still on the statute books.

Mr Simelane, the Communications Manager for The Rock of Hope, told The Daily Beast that the LGBT community cannot hide forever. They need visibility. He believes that the parade will create safe spaces for the LGBTs within the Swati community where owners of gay bars would open and operate such with no fear of backlash. Simelane believes that this could be possible if the LGBT community garners the support of local businesses, artists and Eswatini as a community. It all starts here, with visibility.

Excerpt 2

Kasha Nabagesera: The face of Uganda's LGBTQ movement By Bianca Britton: Adapted from CNN (March 7, 2017)

In Uganda, where homosexual acts are punishable by prison sentences, being openly gay requires an astounding amount of courage. Kasha Jacqueline Nabagesera is not only incredibly open about her sexuality, she has made fighting for the rights of Uganda's lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender (LGBT) community her life's work.

And it has not been easy. She limits communication with strangers to shield her from daily harassment and serious threats. The activist says she has repeatedly been evicted from rented homes because her neighbours don't condone her sexuality and, due to fear of being attacked, she does not use public transport or walk the streets alone.

But to continue her fight against homophobia in Uganda, Nabgesera says it is a price worth paying. Nabagesera spent most of her school years trying to avoid suspensions and expulsions. In the subsequent years, Nabagesera says she received countless suspensions and expulsions from various schools as her sexual orientation became increasingly apparent.

But it was while she was studying accounting at Nkumba University that she started to feel particularly targeted. She was made to sign a memorandum of understanding with the university administration that she would start dressing like a 'proper' woman and had to report every day to show them that. She says she was forbidden from wearing baseball caps and any other clothes that were considered to be for boys. She was not allowed within a 100 meters of the female students' dormitory rooms.

Excerpt 3

LGBT community still faces high levels of violence - report

"We're queer and we are here!" is the declarative title of a new report on lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender (LGBT) South Africans which reveals that while tolerance is rising, being part of this at least 800 000-strong community often comes at devastating, sometimes fatal, cost.

A staggering four out of ten LGBT South Africans know of someone who has been murdered "for being or suspected of being" lesbian, gay, bisexual or transgender. Black members of this community are twice as likely (49%) as white respondents (26%) to know of someone who was murdered on these grounds. The risks are particularly high for black LGBT people in rural areas.

The research, drawing on a range of sources, is contained in the latest monthly edition of Fast Facts released today by the Centre for Risk Analysis at the South African Institute of Race Relations (IRR). The report acknowledges "a growing trend" of tolerance and "open-

mindedness". A majority of South Africans support constitutional protections for LGBT people and display high levels of tolerance for their gay neighbours, while, across Africa, younger and better-educated people are increasingly tolerant. However, the greater emphasis is on the discrimination against and risks confronted by LGBT people. IRR notes that while LGBT rights are entrenched in South Africa's Constitution, this protection "is not always guaranteed".

Intolerance measured in the research ranges from verbal insults and threats of physical violence to being chased or followed, having objects thrown at them, personal property and possessions being damaged or destroyed, being punched, hit, kicked or beaten, experiencing violence or physical abuse from a family member.

Question 2

The gospel faces a crisis as recent events in the media have shown pastors resurrecting the dead, making congregants eat grass and some of them going to the extent of calling God from their cell phones in front of church members.
