The expansion of sugarcane fields has reduced grazing land in the sugarcane belt of Swaziland. The remaining grazing land which is mostly thornveld with Acacia and other tree species has low carrying capacity. Though livestock rearing especially cattle rearing has remained an important activity for sugarcane farmers, productivity has been going down due to inadequate grazing. For a sustainable crop-livestock farming system there is a need to integrate sugarcane farming with animal farming. Sugarcane tops and molasses are cheap, locally available animal fed resources. Tops from commercial cane are currently being ploughed back into the soil. Generally sugarcane tops are regarded as a reject of no commercial value. Some farmers are of the opinion that feeding of cane tops and molasses could benefit their breeding cows which normally lose weight during the dry season. Unfortunately they do not have any information to substantiate their claims. They are all too willing to provide 40 dry cows (none lactating cows) and all the cane tops required to carry out an investigation to see if supplementing dry cows during the dry season would stop or at least reduce weight loss.
