

 - iv) Sewing fasteners on double fabric
 - v) Under stitching collars, facings etc.
 - vi) Pressing garments during construction

 - iii) Front hip pocket



a) Using the illustrations below, describe and complete/fill in the missing steps followed when sewing and attaching a collar.




