### **QUESTION 1**

In the case of *Dawson v Helicopter Exploration Company*, correspondence had been exchanged between two parties which did not make it clear if there was a contract. Plaintiff had been offered a 10% share in exploration rights if he would accompany the defendant on exploration flights. The plaintiff wrote back: "If you will inform me, if and when you obtain a pilot for your helicopter, I will immediately take steps ... to be on hand." Defendant ignored the "agreement".

Referring closely to the seminal case of **Pitout v North Cape Livestock Co-op Ltd** (describing all the facts and judgment), analytically decide whether a contract was concluded between Plaintiff and Defendant above.
