SCENARIO

Last year she got married to Leonard Mthupa, a 30 year old Chartered Accountant from the University of London, who is the Director finance at NEDBank. The Mthupha family have a good combined income which has enabled them to buy a house, a medium size farm and two family cars. In addition, they have some livestock which are at Mthupha's home in Lavumisa. Mthupha's father is a retired civil servant and the mother, La-Simelane, will soon be a retiring secondary school teacher. The Mthupha's have a nine month old daughter, Nomzamo.

Before the birth of Nomzamo, the Mthuphas had enough time for each other as well as their career. Things changed in the first three months of Nomzamo's arrival. Manesi got her maternity leave and gave all her attention to their baby, and since her return to Sipho and Associates property valuers' firm she has experienced a lot of mounting pressure from both her employers and clients. She now does not have enough time for the baby. Nomzamo is most of the times under the care of Busisiwe the baby-sister. Leonard, on the hand, seems to have switched this attention from wife to the new arrival, Nomzamo. Manesi complains that now Leonard does not care about her. She thinks it might be wise if they contact Leonard's parents to take in the grand-daughter for a few days, in order for them to sort themselves out. Leonard is adamant that Nomzamo is better off under his roof than at the grand parents' in the rural areas.
