QUESTION 1

- a) What is the difference between map reading and map interpretation? (10 marks)
- b) Explain how you can assist Geography pupils who experience difficulties in reading and interpretation of maps. (15 marks)

From the IGCSE/SGSCE Geography syllabus attached take Theme 2.3 and

- (a) Write an overall aim for the sub theme. (2 marks)
- (b) Write four (4) objectives in the cognitive domain. (8 marks)
- (c) Write one objective in the psychomotor domain. (2 marks)
- (d) Write one objective in the affective domain. (2 marks)
- (e) State the teaching/learning activities you would employ when teaching the sub theme.(6 marks)
- (f) Formulate five questions you would use to evaluate the teaching and learning of the pupils. (5 questions). [TOTAL: 25 MARKS]

QUESTION 4

'Text books have become an almost inseparable part of the present school system. They are certainly one of the most commonly used media. Yet they are probably also the most misused media in classrooms' (van Rooyen and van der Merwe, 1996: 247).

With reference to the above quotation:

- (a) Discuss the role of text books in the teaching and learning of Geography. (15 marks)
- (b) Explain the disadvantages of relying on text books to teach Geography.(8)
- (c) Describe how the disadvantages of using text books can be offset.(2)

"One of the important commonly recurring criticisms levelled by school administrators against student teachers, and inexperienced or untrained teachers, is that they do not know how to organize and plan effectively for teaching" (Kasambira, 1993: 18).
