Question 2

(a) List the four instructional models as identified by Joyce and Weil (1986).

(b) Instructional models are used to select and structure teaching strategies, methods, skills, and student activities for a particular instructional emphasis (Saskatchewan Education, 1991). Using examples from the four instructional models that you have identified above, justify the above claim.[21marks]

Question 3

Identify a topic/sub-topic from one of your teaching subjects where the discussion method could be used.

- (a) Justify why the discussion method would be the best choice of instructional method to use in presenting the topic/sub-topic selected above. [5 marks]
- (b) Holding a successful classroom discussion involves planning. Describe the steps that you will take to plan for a successful classroom discussion.

(c) What could be some of the things that might go wrong during a discussion that you will need to guard against as you use the discussion method in class?
