- 5. What a person knows is actively constructed by the learner;
- 6. Since knowledge is based on personal interpretation of experiences, one person's knowledge cannot be transferred to another person, and
- 7. Teaching is about empowering learners and allowing them to discover and reflect on realistic experiences.
