Both have been classified as having low vision. Ron has helped Renata considerably, both emotionally and in adjusting in her new environment and being able to move around. Ron reads Braille fluently, but Renata is having great difficulty reading Braille. She also seems to have had problems relating to her former classmates, with whom she has spent so many enjoyable hours. She was a very clever child, but since her illness and blindness, she seems to have lost the intensity of interest in her studies that she had had.

- b. Look at your budget and the facilities that are available. What would be the easiest adaptation for you to make in the learning environment that would permit education in the least restrictive environment and still meet the needs of Renata and Ron?

- d. What special skills might you want to help Ron or Renata develop, and how would you go about developing these skills?
