- a. Describe the meaning of the term "sustainable". Include in your answer an outline of the fundamental components that should typify sustainable environmental health practice. (15 marks)
- b. What is the difference between environmental impact assessment and environmental auditing? (10 marks)

- a. Explain the meaning of the following: environmental impact, environmental aspect, environmental effect, comprehensive mitigation plan, and alternatives as they relate to environmental impact assessment. (10 marks)
- b. While conducting an environmental audit of a large corporation, an associate audit is sometimes required. Explain the aim(s) of the associate audit and how it is done. (15 marks)

QUESTION THREE

- a. Nxumalo and associates a waste management company is offering services of medical waste collection and disposal to the Mbabane clinic. It has been noticed that this company disposes off the waste at the Mpolonjeni tip site, and the Swaziland Environmental Authority is suspecting that this waste might be polluting the Mpolonjeni River and wants to close the company down. Your company of environmental management services has been offered the tender to carry out an environmental audit of this company to find out if it is complying with the Swaziland environmental management Act of 2002, Swaziland water services Act of 2000, and the Swaziland waste management regulations of 2000. Which type of environmental audit will you adopt? Explain the objectives of this audit type, and how you are going to go about it. (15 marks)
- b. One of the criteria for environmental auditing is that the auditing system must not be seen as a policing system but rather as a self-regulatory tool to improve environmental management performance at all levels of the enterprise. Defend this statement. (5 marks)
- c. One of the activities done on the location or site during an environmental audit exercise is identification of management control systems. Motivate this statement. (5 marks)

QUESTION FOUR

Discuss the five problems surrounding the development of alternatives in carrying out an Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) process listed below. (5 marks each)

- 1. Narrow definition of the problem (purpose and need) dictates and constricts possible solutions (alternatives)
- 2. The "problem" can be constructed to justify the "solution".
- 3. Alternatives are subject to agency agendas and agency autonomy.
- 4. Alternatives are also subject to stock solutions and problem framing.
- 5. Other alternatives may be intentionally made less attractive.

Congratulations! You have been appointed to head a consultancy company in carrying out an environmental impact assessment study for the construction of a new faculty of health to be constructed at Pine Valley. Explain how you are going to manage this daunting EIA process.
