QUESTION ONE

- A). The International Health Regulations (2005) is a legal binding instrument that contributes to international public health security.
- i). State the date on which the said Regulations entered into force.

- ii). Explain how the said Regulations contribute to international public health security. (6 marks)
- B). In terms of Articles 5, 13 and Annex 1 of the International Health Regulations (2005) State Parties shall develop capacity to detect, assess, notify and report events and shall develop capacity to respond promptly and effectively to public health risks and public health emergencies of international concern as set out in Annex 1.
- i). Specify the areas in respect of which such core capacities have to be developed by State Parties as provided in Annex 1. (4 marks)
- ii). Specify the time limit within which State Parties shall develop the capacities you specified in (i) above. (4 marks)
- iii). Specify the tools that State Parties shall use to meet their core capacity requirements under the Regulations, as provided in Annex 1. (4 marks)
- iv). State the definition of the following expressions as provided in the Regulations:
 - a). "public health risk" (3 marks)
 - b). "public health emergency of international concern" (6 marks)

v). Specify the core capacity requirements for State Parties to respond to events that may constitute a public health emergency of international concern as provided in Annex 1 Part B paragraph 2. (21 marks)

- d). List the requirements relating to the document you stated in (b) above as provided in Annex 6 paragraphs 3 to 8. (18 marks)
