QUESTION ONE

In terms of Article 6 of the International Health Regulations (2005) each State Party has an obligation to assess events occurring within its territory by using the decision instrument in Annex 2 and to notify WHO of events that may constitute a public health emergency of international concern.

- a). State the definition of the expression "public health emergency of international concern" as provided in the Regulations. (6 marks)
- b). Describe the criteria for assessing and notifying WHO of events that may constitute a public health emergency of international concern set out in the said instrument, citing the relevant diseases specified in respect of each criterion. (30 marks)
- c). What is mode of notification to WHO and the time limit within which to notify assessed events? (4 marks)
- d). State the obligation of WHO, following notification by a State Party of an event that may constitute a public health emergency of international concern, citing the relevant provision of the Regulations. (6 marks)
- e). State the obligation of a State Party, following a notification to WHO in respect of information on the notified event. (4 marks)

Specify the health measures that a State Party may require for public health purposes, on arrival or departure with regard to travelers and baggage, cargo, containers, conveyances, postal parcels and human remains, in terms of Article 23 (1) of the International Health Regulations (2005). - b). State the general and specific duties of State Parties in relation to treatment of travelers, in implementing health measures under the International Health Regulations (2005), in terms of Article 32 thereof.
