#### **QUESTION ONE**

#### Part A

You are a public health inspector employed by the Matsapha Town Board. You have this day entered into a factory at the Matsapha Industrial Site, examined it and found that it is not in a clean state, overcrowded, badly lighted or ventilated, and thus likely to be dangerous to the health of the employees.

- a). What do the conditions you found in the factory constitute? (3 marks)
- b). Specify the action you would take based on your finding, citing relevant authority. (4 marks)
- c). State the persons against whom you would take the action. (4 marks)

- a). Specify the duties of local authorities regarding the control of pollution of water, in terms of the Public Health Act, 1969. (6 marks)
- b). State the major point sources of pollution of water. (4 marks)
- c). What is the rationale for the requirement for an effluent control permit in terms of Section 62 of the Water Act, 2003? (4 marks)

#### **QUESTION TWO**

#### Part A

You are a public officer and have been designated by the Director of the Swaziland Environment Authority as an officer authorised to enforce the Waste Regulations, 2000. You have this day stopped, entered and searched a motor vehicle transporting hazardous and clinical waste for export.

- a). What is the collective term to describe the type of waste you found in the motor vehicle? (3 marks)
- b). State the general prohibition and duty imposed on the person transporting the waste in terms of the Regulations. (3 marks)
- c). Specify the documents you would require from the person transporting such waste.
