Her husband describes her recent behaviours as being extremely unstable with rapidly alternating moods. "She is driving me and the kids crazy, crying and talking about herself one day and out shopping for a new glitzy wardrobe the next. She tried to go back to work right after she got out of hospital the first time, but the principal put her on leave of absence with the end of year. He said she made a pass (proposing to) at him and was behaving flirtatiously toward the coaches and even some of the students."

a) What is probably wrong with Nomsiko? Justify your answer.b) How should her condition be managed?(4)

QUESTION 5

Ruud is a 26 year old insurance underwriter who is seen by a nurse in the outpatient department for a minor cold. During the examination he ask whether he might be anemic because he was "just exhausted all the time." Ruud reveals that for the past month he had difficulty getting out of bed in the morning. Getting dressed and ready for work left him drained. He describes standing in front of his wardrobe for long periods, unable to decide what to wear. He is having extreme difficulty calling on and keeping appointments with potential clients. Previously, he was normally an assertive person who called on strangers with ease but now sits at his desk for hours, trying to work up the motivation to pick up the phone. His work mates, including his supervisor, have commented on his 10 kg weight gain and these comments precipitated uncharacteristic angry and tearful out bursts at work.

a) Do a DSM 1V multiaxial diagnosis of Ruud (5) b) Justify the diagnosis given to Ruud in a) (15)
