## Question 1

A midwife is working in a public health unit, where he offers services to childbearing women including antenatal care. The unit has just commenced a surveillance study that involves obligatory testing of all pregnant women for HIV. A woman comes in for her first ANC visit, and is required to consent to have a blood specimen taken from her by the midwife at the clinic. The woman declines consent to have her blood drawn for the test.

- 1.2 Is the woman ethically correct in refusing to consent to be tested for HIV where the unit has made testing mandatory? How so? (15 marks)

- 2.2 Draw the distinction between legal midwifery practice and ethical midwifery practice and their relationship to professional practice. Illustrate your responses by making examples.
