Question 2

When confronted about his behaviour, he says there is nothing abnormal about him and threatens anyone questioning his conduct with violence. As a child, he never finished elementary school because he was truant and violent to both teachers and students and stole valuables such as money from his parents which he denied when confronted and attributed the thefts to his younger siblings.
