#### **QUESTION 1**

## **QUESTION 2**

The family is viewed as a basic institution for socialising individual family members. Due to changes occurring in the family structure, this family function seems to have been disturbed.

- a) Discuss how the following have disturbed the family of this basic and important function:
- i) Child-headed family
- ii) Single-parenthood (6)
- b) One of the components of family structure is its belief system. Discuss how the family belief system may negatively influence family health. (3)
- c) Read the given passage and then answer the questions that follow:

  Sizakele Dludlu, a divorcee who decided to remarry, was given custody of her two school going children of ages 7 and 8 years. Their father Mandla, who also remarried, cares for the children as part of the couple's joint custody agreement which Mandla usually violets by forgetting to come for the children at every month end and this infuriates Sizakele. Sizakele's new husband never had children of his own in his previous marriage, but was happy to be married to a woman who already

had children. They both expected that the marriage and family life together would be smooth. However, Sizakele's children appear very strained when relating to their new father and they seem to resent the marriage. Sizakele is living with hypertension and is on treatment for that. When her new husband disciplines the children for misbehaving, Sizakele yells at him and tells him that disciplining the children is her responsibility as she is the children's biological parent. When Sizakele asks for financial assistance from her new husband when the former has not provided for the children, he becomes agitated and when she decides to take the children to their biological father as they agreed on joint custody, the new husband does not appear happy.

- ii. From the children's perspective what other family form are they in?

- iii. Mention seven (7) primary issues that this family is facing (7)
