Question 1

Situation: You are on a home visit assessing an elderly client who is confined to bed due to fracture of the hip. The client's family members have been providing care to the client. On examination, you observe a small, reddened area in the gluteal region of the client.

A. Describe any **five points** (with rationale) you will consider when giving health education to the caregivers on the prevention of pressure ulcers? (10)

Question 2

Situation: Mr Nhleko is a 76 year old man who comes to your clinic complaining of chest pains when coughing and when taking a deep breath. He also complains of shortness of breath (SOB) and coughing up blood stained sputum. O/E; hypoxic, labored respirations noted.

A. Explain with rationale how you will prepare Mr Nhleko for the assessment of the thorax and lungs.

- B. Describe your auscultation (with rationale) of Mr Nhleko's posterior thorax to assess for breath sounds. (12)
- C. State any three (3) actual nursing diagnoses relevant for Mr Nhleko's condition. (3)
- D. List any three (3) abnormalities found on inspection of the posterior chest with regard to shape and configuration of the chest wall. (3)

Question 3

Situation: Mr Zulu is an 85 year old man coming to your care accompanied by his 74 year old wife. His wife tells you that Mr Zulu has history of inability to see with his right eye and getting lost to familiar places. Upon general inspection Mr Zulu is wearing his trouser and shirt inside out, very inquisitive, wearing eye glasses, tearing and blood filled eyes noted.

- A. Explain the five (5) basics of operation of the ophthalmoscope you will follow when viewing Mr Zulu's internal eye structures. (10)
- B. State any six (6) warning signs for Alzheimer's disease.
