QUESTION 1

This question has two sections: section A (true or false) and section B (a structured question). Answer all questions from both sections.

SECTION A: TRUE OR FALSE.

State whether the statements below are true or false by writing your answer as either T for true or F for false against the number representing the statement, e.g. 99 = T. Each correct answer carries one (1) mark.

- 1. Binge eating is a disorder common in adolescents and young adults.
- 2. Sexual dysfunction disorders are more common in early adulthood.
- 3. More women suffer from sexual dysfunction disorder than men.
- 4. People diagnosed with hoarding disorder are more likely to also suffer from major depression.
- 5. Children raised by same sex parents are at higher risk for gender dysphoria than those of parents of opposite sex.
- 6. Male adolescents are more likely to suffer from antisocial disorder than female adolescents.
- 7. People with narcissistic personality disorder exhibit a sense of grandiosity.
- 8. Ritalin is CNS stimulant prescribed for children with ADHD.
- 9. Genetic, socio-environmental factors are implicated in almost all mental disorders.
- 10. Mental health problems have the potential to complicate to mental disorders.

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SECTION B

Anna is an elderly woman who lives at Msunduza. Anna has been living alone following the death of her husband 7 years ago. You learned about her from the Rural Health Motivator (RHM) during one of your community mental health practicals. You then went to visit her where you found her "swimming" in dirt of old clutter, with literally no space to sit or move around the house. When you ask her why she was not discarding the clutter, she stated that these were memorabilia for her late husband. The RHM stated that Anna has a child a son, who hardly visits her, and that the last time he visited he clashed with his mother over the clutter and he swore that he would never come back until her mother sorted herself out. Anna confirmed that she had a son that hardly visited her because he thinks she is "crazy".

- 1. What is wrong with Anna? Explain your answer (5 marks)
- 2. With the goal of preventing her from falling back to her disorder, outline how you would manage Anna. (1 mark for every correct point to maximum of 10marks).
