Raid on Animal laboratory

Over the weekend animal liberationists raided a local research laboratory where animals are used in tests to find out the effects of drugs. The break-in occurred at Symons Pharmaceutical Research Laboratory in Maversham Place. The raid was discovered only on Monday morning. The police were called to investigate.

'There was considerable damage to expensive equipment,' said a spokesman for the laboratory, 'and the intruders vandalised several rooms in the building. They also stole some of the animals used for research purposes.'

The *Post* has interviewed a local animal liberationist activist who claims to know the identity of the raiders. 'The public would be quite appalled at the cruelty of the practices carried out in the labs, if they knew the full story. We intend to get the facts to the public.' When asked about the illegality of the break-in and the subsequent damage to expensive equipment and buildings, the spokesman said: 'We've tried reasoning with these people but they're only interested in their profits. Director action of this kind is the only thing they understand. There will be more incidents of this kind until these horrific experiments on defenceless animals cease.'

A spokesman for the police said they were interviewing local animal rights campaigners and were confident they would be preferring serious charges soon. The spokesman for the Symons Laboratory insisted that such criminal actions would not effect any change in the laboratory policy.
