 - (iii) Formulate a research problem that may be investigated using either a qualitative OR a quantitative research method. Delineate and define the essential aspects of the problem. (10 marks)
- 2. An article in a research journal, *Literati Africana*, is titled, "Vulgarity Among UNISWA Male Students." Part of the abstract of the report reads, thus: "The method used in this study was the survey. Responses of a majority of the 150 students that constituted the sample showed that five words were rated as the commonest lewd words that feature in conversations that take place in male hostels."

Would you use the same or a different research method if you were to conduct such a study? **Justify** whichever position you take; then, **outline** how you would conduct your study. (15 marks)
