Select the heroine from either of the two texts whose depiction is akin to the romance ideal; cite and discuss the reasons for your choice. [30]

Question Four

Place of Destiny (2005) Margaret Ogola

- a) Critically examine the advancement of themes in <u>Place of Destiny</u> from a feminist /womanist perspective. [20]
- b) Has the novel moved you in any way? Discuss briefly. [10]

Question Five

The Prodigal Husband (1999) Lazarus Miti

- a) Identify the aspects of social realism Miti has focused upon in <u>The Prodigal Husband</u>. [10]
- b) Focusing on ONE of these, discuss his use of story and character to advance his social criticism. [15]
- c) Briefly state to what extent you agree with him. [5]
