Write brief explanatory notes on each of the following:

- a. The productive capacity of human language (10 marks).
- b. The differences between hearing and listening (5 marks).
- c. Argumentum ad hominem (5 marks).
- d. Common core features of the English language (10 marks).

Question 2 (30 marks)

- a. Distinguish between the concepts of **time** and **tense** in the English language (15 marks).
- b. Describe the ways in which the English language marks future time (15 marks)

Question 3 (30 marks)

- a. What is "Standard English"? (10 marks)
- b. In what ways have **common core features** assisted the English language to remain one single language despite its many regional varieties? (20 marks).

SECTION B (LITERATURE TOPICS)

In this section, do not repeat or write about the same text at length more than once.

Question 4 (30 marks)

How has African Diaspora literature harnessed the African culture to its advantage? Use the work of at least one African-American writer to substantiate your argument.

Question 5 (30 marks)

How have African-American feminist scholars gained from the Western feminist experience? Cite at least two texts and writers to advance your argument.

Question 6 (30 marks)

Does African-American literature share similarities with African Continental literature? Explain this clearly with themes in texts that manifest these commonalities in both literatures.
