Pick **THREE** of the following excerpts and do the following:

- a) Identify the work from which each is taken. (3)
- b) Identify the author of the work from which the excerpt is taken. (3)
- c) Write a brief essay explaining the relevance of the quotation to the themes and literary techniques of the work as a whole. (24) [30]
- i. "I feel awful. I feel awful. I feel I'm horrible."
- ii. That branchless ash, Unsunned and damp, whose few poor yellow leaves Ne'ver tremble in the gale, yet tremble still, Fanned by the waterfall!

Using Browning's poems, "Porphyria's Lover" and "My Last Duchess", illustrate how the character of the persona is revealed unintentionally. [30]

Question 4

Demonstrate how Gerard Manley Hopkins has used the concepts: Inscape, Instress and Selving to reveal God as the greatest architect of all time in his sonnet, "God's Grandeur". [30]

Question 5

Discuss how T.S. Elliot and D.H. Lawrence advanced the theme of fragmented self-esteem in their works, "The Love Song of J. Alfred Prufrock" and "The Horse Dealer's Daughter", respectively. [30]
