QUESTION ONE

- B. Compare and contrast the New World Slavery of the period c.1600 1860 with classical world slavery.

With reference to the effects of the Atlantic Slave upon African societies, critically assess the merits and demerits of the "transformation thesis" in the historiography of the trade.

QUESTION FOUR

Why did the study of the Indian Ocean slave trade lag behind that of its Atlantic counterpart for so many years?

QUESTION FIVE

Would you accept the view that domestic slavery in Africa was comparatively "mild"?

QUESTION SIX

In late 2006 the British Prime Minister Tony Blair was reported by the BBC to have expressed his "deep sorrow" over Britain 's role in the slave trade, describing it as "profoundly shameful". From an historian's point of view, do you think the West should apologize for the Atlantic slave trade? Explain.
