3. **EITHER** (a) Discuss the factors that led to the centralization of capital in the diamond mining industry in South Africa between 1867 and 1902.

- (b) "Boom and slump". Is this an appropriate description of the development of the gold mining industry in South Africa between 1886 and 1902?
4. Drawing examples from three countries, give a critical analysis of the role and impact of railways in Southern Africa up to 1902?
5. Evaluate any five scholars' views on the causes of the South African War (1899- 1902).
