## **JMC 303: PRINT REPORTING**

- 1. "Reporting involves two main activities: fact gathering and news writing; both of which have certain fundamental requirements that can be compromised only to the detriment of a news story." Do the following. (40 marks)
  - (i) State the fundamental requirements of fact gathering. (10 marks)
  - (ii) State the fundamental requirements of news writing. (10 marks)
  - (iii) Evaluate the attached news story from a Swazi newspaper in terms of the fundamental requirements of fact gathering and news writing. (20 marks)
- 2. It is May 2010, and you have been assigned to do an **in-depth** story on the Sikhupe International Airport a story scheduled for publication before the World Cup kicks up in June 2010. **Outline** the tasks involved in this assignment and **brief** your editor about how you would carry out the tasks. (20 marks)
- 3. "The *reporter* and the *researcher* are but two of a kind; as such, knowledge and ability pertaining to research invariably enhance reporting." **Discuss**.

- 4. Identify FIVE types of lead and write an example of each type. (20 marks)
- 5. As a reporter, you should be concerned with how your newspaper is designed, as well as how headlines are cast for your news story. Explain newspaper design and headline writing. (20 marks)
- 6. Analyse the basic elements involved in the two most popular methods of reporting: observation and interviewing. (20 marks)
