

'Rapist' caugh in act beaten up

MBABANE - A 24-year old MABABANE - A 24-year old man was on Sunday morning severally beaten after being caught allegedly raping a 46-year old woman at Msunduza location.

A resident of this densely populated sturn was able to capture an almost six-minute film, using his mobile phone, of the alleged rapist sexually assaulting the woman and the beatings he received thereafter.

The rape occurred at a home that is next to a popular drinking spot and information gathered is that the alleged rapist, identified only as Bongani, and the victim were both separately enjoying alcoholic drinks at the shebeen.

The resident, who preferred anonymity, said he was awakened by sounds of the two tussling near his house as the rapist forced himself on the woman.

"At first I thought they were just lovers who were mischievously en-joying themselves next to the house but I then realised that a rape was going on after seeing the man hit the woman in the face while they were both on the ground," the resident said.

The video shows the man hitting the woman several times on the face as she tried to resist, and as she succumbed to his demands, he then continued to have his way with the 46-year old woman. vear old woman.

At one point, the woman is also seen trying to regain her strength and pushes the man away but he again hit and pressed her down be-fore continuing with his misdemean-

our.

There is a point where the woman also cried for help but no one came to her rescue even though a patron of the shebeen is captured answering the call of nature just metres.

away.
The resident, after some minutes, then decided to enlist help from people who were in the shebeen and they came in their numbers to see

The rapist was severely beaten up, stripped of his trousers and struck on his private parts, after which the police were called.

Deputy police PRO Assistant Superintendent Wendy Hleta said the suspect rapist was taken to hospital by the police where he was treated and would make his first court appearance today.

"The incident happened at a drinkling spree and the woman was going
to answer the call of nature when the
man took advantage of her," Hleta
said, adding that the woman was also
taken to the doctor.

The rapist, according to Hleta, had
his eye injured but would recover
hence he was going to appear in
court.

The victim also spotted a swollen face as a result of the fists she was subjected to by the rapist.

Rape is forced, unwanted sexual rape is forced, unwanted sexual intercourse. Rape, sometimes also called sexual assault, can happen to both men and women of any age. Rape is about power, not sex. A rapist uses actual force or violence - or the threat of it - to take con-trol over another human being. Some rapists use drugs to take away a person's ability to fight back. Rape is a crime, whether the person com-mitting it is a stranger, a date; an acquaintance, or a family member,
