As a journalist working for the *Swazi Herald* newspaper, you receive information that the Swaziland Energy Regulatory Authority (SERA) has approved a 16 percent increase of electricity tariffs by the Swaziland Electricity Company (SEC). SEC had asked for an increase of 25.3 percent in 2010/2011. The SEC had also made requests for an increase of 26.3 percent in 2011/2012 and 26.4 percent in 2012/2013. The reason SEC wants a tariff increase is because of the high cost of importing electricity from Eskom in South Africa.

- a) Based on the above information, write a lead paragraph for your newspaper.
- b) Explain what type of lead paragraph you have used for your news story and why?
- c) Who are the people you are likely to interview and why for this news story?

# MINISTRY OF HEALTH NATIONAL MEASLES CAMPAIGN 2010 (27TH OCTOBER - 5TH NOVEMBER 2010)



The Ministry of Health in collaboration with UNICEF and WHO will embark on a nation wide immunization campaign against Measles.

This exercise will start on Wednesday 27th October 2010 and end on Friday 5th November 2010.

During this period all children **aged from birth to 5 years** should be taken to the nearest health facilities (hospitals, health centres and clinics), routine outreach service points, and other places that will be announced for immunization.

At these sites children will be immunized against Measles, and other diseases.

Dates and names of the sites which will be visited by health workers will be mounted in market places, shops, and the sites where the immunization service will be provided. In addition continuous adverts will be aired in the SiSwati Channel of Radio Swaziland and run at Swazi TV.

ALL CHILDREN UNDER 5 YEARS ARE URGED TO COME FOR THE SERVICES AS FROM 27TH OCTOBER - 5TH NOVEMBER 2010.

PARENTS/GUARDIANS AND CARETAKERS ARE REQUESTED TO BRING ALONG THEIR CHILD HEALTH CARDS, BUT EVEN IF THEY DO NOT HAVE THE CARDS THEY MUST STILL COME.
