woman cuts lovers tongue as couple kisses


NSANGWINI - A 42 year old woman of Nsangwini has cut her lover (49)'s tongue while the couple kissed near a drinking spot on saturday afternoon. This happened while the couple was drunk from buganu wine.


The incedent happened as the couple, identified as rose Mpila and Mankelekeshane Dlamini, well known as Sonkeshe were drinking at a local Shebeen known as kaMzundane. About fifty people were present at the homestead as the couple left around 3pm to a nearby bush with a jar filled with the wine. After about twenty minutes of their departure Sonkeshe came back running and bleeding from the mouth which he covered with his hand which was also painted red by blood.

When he arrived at the shiebeen, the crowd was shocked and the shebeen queen, Mariah Ndzabukelwako was quick to call an ambulance. When Sonkeshe removed the hand from the mouth, it was found that a portion of his tongue was cut and left hanging by a very small piece. He tried to Communicate using sign language when asked by mariah who was responsible for selling the wine on the day. Mariah said, "I was very shocked, to witness such because the guy couldn't talk completely, so he tried sign language to tell us that it was done by his lover while they were kissing and did not want to press charges against her, because someonesuggested calling the police," said she.

The ambulance came after an hour and rushed him to Piggs Peak Government Hospital where he also refused to press charges against the woman when advised by the nurses. He was discharged on monday and he could talk but couldn't pronounce words like he was before. The hanging piece of the tongue was removed and the wound was treated. When caught in an interview, Sonkeshe said, "Idont believe this he exclaimed, we fell to a disagreement on Friday and it ended badly because I beat her. I felt like I was wrong to beat her, the next morning I went to ask for forgiveness and she preteded she was forgiving me. I then invited her to the shebeen where we met after lunch." He further said rose wanted time for them away from people and he agreed because he thought they were going to enjoy their love life. He said theykissed as usual but Rose got aggressive as they carried on and that s when the tongue was cutt and she ran away.

Rose refused to comment on the matter and said she doesn't want to talk about it. She said she hoped the story will not be published in the Kwaluseni Herald newspaper. The couple lives on separate households. Mankelekeshane was left by his wife in 2015 and Rose has been a widow from 2106.

AGRICULTURE AND SOUTH-SOUTH COOPERATION

A HIGH PROPORTION OF ECONOMIES OF THE GLOBAL SOUTH ARE ANCHORED IN AGRICULTURE, A SECTOR WHERE THE MAIN UPKEEP OF THE SOUTHERN POPULATION IS DEPENDENT.

IN THE KINGDOM OF ESWATINI AGRICULTURE IS THE BACKBONE OF OUR ECONOMY. THE MAJORITY OF OUR PEOPLE ARE FARMERS. WE HAVE BOTH SUBSISTENCE AND COMMERCIAL FARMERS.

THE AGRICULTURAL SECTOR PROVIDES A LIFELINE FOR MANY NATIONS AND IS FUNDAMENTAL IN ENDING HUNGER AND POVERTY, PARTICULARLY TO THE RURAL POPULATIONS. IT IS ALSO AN IMPORTANT SECTOR FOR VALUE-ADDITION PROSPECTS, THUS PROMOTING PRODUCT AND MARKET DIVERSIFICATION AS WELL AS INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT, AMONG OTHERS.

HOWEVER, THE EFFECTS OF CLIMATE CHANGE CONTINUE TO AFFECT OUR FARMER'S PRODUCTION IMMENSELY. IT IS ALSO HAVING DEVASTATTING EFFECTS ON HUMAN LIVES AS WITNESSED WITH TROPICAL CYCLONE IDAI THAT HAS CLAIMED THE LIVES OF HUNDREDS OF OUR FELLOW COUNTRYMEN IN MOZAMBIQUE, ZIMBABWE AND MALAWI. LET US JOIN HANDS TO SUPPORT INITIATIVES TO AVERT THESE TRAGEDIES.

WE SHOULD THEREFORE, INVEST IN APPROPRIATE TECHNOLOGIES AND INNOVATIONS THAT WOULD LEAD TO INCREASED AGRICULTURAL PRODUCTIVITY AT THE NATIONAL, REGIONAL AND INTER-REGIONAL LEVELS IN ORDER TO PRODUCE ENOUGH FOOD FOR OURSELVES.

THE GLOBAL SOUTH IS ENDOWED WITH A VIBRANT DEMOGRAPHIC DIVIDEND OF YOUNG PEOPLE THAT NEED TO BE HARNESSED, SUPPORTED AND EMPOWERED WITH APPROPRIATE KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS AND TECHNICAL KNOW-HOW THAT WOULD TRANSFORM ECONOMIES OF THE SOUTH. THERE IS A NEED TO CREATE EXCHANGE PROGRAMMES FOR OUR YOUTH TO BENEFIT FROM EXPERIENCES FROM OUR COOPERATION.

CURRENTLY, THE KINGDOM IS ENCOURAGING OUR SCHOOLS AND TERTIARY INSTITUTIONS TO DESIGN ENTREPRENEURIAL CURRICULUM. WE BELIEVE SUCH MODALITIES WILL INCREASE OPPORTUNITIES FOR YOUNG PEOPLE TO BE COMPETITIVE IN THE GLOBAL JOB MARKETS OF THE FUTURE AS WELL AS INTEGRATE THEIR SKILLS, INTO THE GLOBAL VALUE CHAIN.
