Answer FOUR questions, TWO from each section. Each question carries 25 marks.

### SECTION A: DATA ANALYSIS

- 1. Examine the *levels* and *techniques* of quantitative data analysis, giving concrete examples.
- 2. Attachment 1 presents part of the data for a study of UNESWA students. Use the data to answer the following questions.

(i) Prepare a codebook and a data matrix.

- (ii) Construct a frequency distribution table for HSWTVD, according to the formal requirements of table construction.
- 3. Answer A or B.
  - A: Explain, with illustration, what is involved in the analysis of data obtained from composite measures such as the Likert Scale or the Semantic Differential Scale.
  - B: Construct a joint frequency table for the data in Attachment 1, according the formal requirements of table construction; then explain the table.
- 4. **Discuss** the activities involved in *qualitative* data analysis.

## SECTION B: REPORT WRITING

- 5. Research report writing begins from the moment the researcher is formulating the research problem, which invariably constitutes the **Introduction** of the report. **Itemise** the things the researcher needs to do in formulating the research problem, with regard to a specific mass communication phenomenon; then write a condensed introduction for your study.
- 6. A prerequisite of report writing is *good writing*. **List** and **describe** SIX qualities of good writing; then **explain** how you would apply them to the chapter on Literature Review and that on Findings.
- 7. **Discuss** documentation in terms of the following: (i) Significance; (ii) Elements; and (iii) Styles.
- 8. **State** how the writing of the *qualitative* research report differs from that of its quantitative counterpart, and then **discuss** TWO of the forms for writing *qualitative* research reports, as described by Creswell (2005).
