International student's grateful to uneswa for a comfortable lockdown

International students from UNESWA said the university hasbeen very helpful in making their stay on campus during the coronavirus lockdown comfortable and safe.

To make international students feel like they are at home, like all other students that went home after the university closed due to the coronavirus outbreak, the university has been generous and flexible in trying to adjust to their needs.

Charity Munikwa a 3rd year law student at kwaluseni, originally from Zimbabe said, This pandemic has affected everyone financially and it has become really hard for some of our parents to send us

money for food because some were laid off at work. Some of them their salaries were cut, and others because of their line of work, they cannot go to work. But the university and some generous people out there, they gave us money to buy our necessities and food."

Munikwa noted that before the lockdown cooking on Campus was not allowed but as a way of accommodating the fact that the students are not home,

the university provided them with a place to cook and also gave them all the equipment needed to make that happen.

Students have been staying on campus for free which they said was so unexpected so they are very grateful to the university for allowing that. There are thirty three international students currently residing in Kwaluseni campus. To ensure safety of all the students in the three UNESWA campuses, Luyeno, Mbabane and Kwaluseni, they moved were to the mother campus Kwaluseni.

A member of the Kwaluseni SRC, Eugine Dlamini said, "Accommodation for the student's is free until the end of the semester. This is on the 3rd of October for continuing students. It ends on the 2nd of september for final students. We have tried our utmostlevel best to make sure their safety and proper welfare is fulfilled. We ensured they are provided with Masks, Sanitizers and the Bathrooms and Toilets are cleaned a number of times during the day."

If the students are not feeling well the university clinic is open for them to get medical attention for free. The students say there hasn't been any serious issue in terms of their health but the Clinic is definitely available for them. Dlamini stated, "the university has even made the clinic available for students in case there are emergencies during late hours like midnight"

The university has tried to ensure that the students maintain their connectionwith their families. Munikwa mentioned that, "They also gave us access to the landline school to call people back home, which has been very helpful because honestly it started really getting to us. The loneliness; the stress missing our families and knowing that it could be a very long time until we see them again. It is all really depressing because the people we are comfortable talking to are miles away. So we are truly thankful to the university for provide us a Phone to call home."

According to Dlamini, "The university has also subscribed to all channels DSTV for the students so that they sometimes watch TV and do not get bored."
