- 1. "Christianity and Judaism start from a common origin" (Parkes, J. *Judaism and Christianity*. Oxford University Press, 1974; page 19). Discuss the problems associated with this relationship and show how they were resolved.
- Comment on Paul's teaching on salvation and show how it influenced the spread of the Gospel.
- 3. Discuss the opportunities and difficulties that the Early Church encountered in its missionary outreach up to AD 400.
- 4. With examples, discuss whether Constantine's patronage of the Church was its greatest triumph or worst disaster.
- 5. Critically comment on Bishop Augustine's response to the Pelagian teaching on baptism and grace.
- 6. Examine the significance of **either** Arius **or** Nestorius to the development of the Christian doctrine on the person of Christ.
- 7. Briefly discuss the major factors that led to the rise and development of monasticism and assess its contribution to the universal church.
- 8. EITHER (a) Discuss the origins and explain the main features of the Greek Orthodox Church.
 - OR (b) Comment on the spiritual and moral situation in the medieval church and show to what extent it was the cause of the continental reformation.
- 9. EITHER (a) "Reformation in England was different from that on the continent" (Brockman, 1991:116). Discuss.
 - OR (b) Briefly discuss the work and achievements of the Council of Trent.
- 10. Discuss the missionary methods that were used in the evangelization of Swaziland.
