- 4. "The case of Arius is a good example of how the Early Church failed to accommodate a divergent interpretation". Discuss.
- 5. Comment on the relationship between Church and State during Constantine's reign.
- 6. Discuss the teaching of Bishop Augustine of Hippo on the nature of the Church and the validity of sacraments.
- 7. Examine the motives and assess the success of the crusades.
- 8. EITHER (a) Why was the reformation in England successful?
 - OR (b) Assess the significance and the impact of the decisions of the Council of Trent for both Catholics and the reformers.
 - OR (c) Discuss Martin Luther contribution to the continental reformation.
- 9. "The Cross went before the Flag". Discuss the relationship between Christian missionaries and colonial agents in Africa.
- 10. Briefly explain the achievements and weaknesses of the Ecumenical Movement in Swaziland.
