- 1. What the Torah is to the Jewish Canon is what the Gospels are to the Christian canon. Discuss this claim in relation to the theological status of the Torah of Moses. [25]
- 2. What do the following stories respectively tell a contemporary reader about the world-view, actions, and religious practices of the ancestors of Israel?
  - a. Yahweh's removal of Abraham from his original homeland in *Genesis 12:1-3*
  - b. Abraham's conversation with Yahweh in Genesis 18: 16-33
  - c. The near-sacrifice of Isaac in Genesis 21
  - d. The pronouncement of the patriarchal blessing by Isaac on Jacob instead of Esau in *Genesis 27:1-40*
  - e. The death and burial of Jacob in Genesis 49:29-50:14

- 3. Conduct a source analysis of Exodus 19. [25]
- 4. Explain the regulations on sexual relations in *Leviticus* 18 from a historical-critical approach. [25]
