To what extent to you agree with the thinking that the gospels are a product of both oral and written sources? [20]

#### Question 2

With reference to evidence in the primary text, what could be the most probable date of the birth of Jesus of Nazareth? [20]

#### **Question 3**

What have to say of Matthew's assertion that "... in the fourth watch of the night he [Jesus] came to them, walking on the sea. But when the disciples saw him walking on the sea, they were terrified, saying, "It is a ghost!" and they cried out for fear." [20]

#### Question 4

Is there a relationship between the historical Jesus and the Jesus preached in the gospels? [20]

#### Question 5

Explain the basis on which Ehrman (2008:209) strongly posits that "it might be possible for Jesus and Judas to be twins." [20]

#### Question 6

Attempt a critical reading of the pericopae provided taken from Matthew 10:1-15. [20]

10 And he called to him his twelve disciples and gave them authority over unclean spirits, to cast them out, and to heal every disease and every infirmity. <sup>2</sup> The names of the twelve apostles are these: first, Simon, who is called Peter, and Andrew his brother; James the son of Zeb'edee, and John his brother; <sup>3</sup> Philip and Bartholomew; Thomas and Matthew the tax collector; James the son of Alphaeus, and Thaddaeus; <sup>[a] 4</sup> Simon the Cananaean, and Judas Iscariot, who betrayed him.

<sup>5</sup> These twelve Jesus sent out, charging them, "Go nowhere among the Gentiles, and enter no town of the Samaritans, <sup>6</sup> but go rather to the lost sheep of the house of Israel. <sup>7</sup> And preach as you go, saying, 'The kingdom of heaven is at hand.' <sup>8</sup> Heal the sick, raise the dead, cleanse lepers, cast out demons. You received without paying, give without pay. <sup>9</sup> Take no gold, nor silver, nor copper in your belts, <sup>10</sup> no bag for your journey, nor two tunics, nor sandals, nor a staff; for the laborer deserves his food.

And whatever town or village you enter, find out who is worthy in it, and stay with him until you depart. <sup>12</sup> As you enter the house, salute it. <sup>13</sup> And if the house is worthy, let your peace come upon it; but if it is not worthy, let your peace return to you. <sup>14</sup> And if any one will not receive you or listen to your words, shake off the dust from your feet as you leave that house or town. <sup>15</sup> Truly, I say to you, it shall be more tolerable on the day of judgment for the land of Sodom and Gomor'rah than for that town.
