Peebo is a 19 years old. He concludes a contract with Mrs Nkosi, an adult to buy a second-hand computer for E2,500-00. Peebo brings Mrs Nkosi under the wrong impression that he is 21 years old by producing a forged identity document. The young man pays a deposit of E250-00 and Mrs Nkosi delivers the computer to him. Peebo now refuses to pay the balance of the purchase price on the ground that he is a minor and therefore not liable in terms of the contract.

(i) A minor who makes a misrepresentation commits a delict and can therefore be held delictually liable, meaning that the prejudiced party has a claim for damages against the minor committing the delict. What are the requirements for delictual liability in these circumstances?
