QUESTION 1

Discuss whether you can institute an action for: pain and suffering; loss of amenities of life; medical and hospital expenses; funeral expenses and future loss of earnings.

A delict has been defied by stating what it is not. Define what a delict is, and include in your answer what you perceive/understand to be the purpose of the law of delict.

Discuss the essential elements of a delict and state the relevancy of each in establishing delictual liability. Illustrate your answer with the aid of decided cases in respect of each element.

A person who willingly consents to the defendant's act in the form of either a specific harmful act or an activity involving risk of harm, cannot complain that a delict has been committed against him. This defence is applied with great caution and circumspection.
