Question 1

Section 2(1) of The Constitution of the Kingdom of Swaziland provides that The constitution is the supreme law of the country and that any law which is inconsistent with the constitution is to the extent of the inconsistency null and void.

Question 2

The primary object of an award of damages is to compensate the person who has suffered harm. Under the *lex aquilia* damages serve to restore the Plaintiff's patrimony and as far as possible, to place the plaintiff in a position s/he, would have been in had the delict not been committed.

Under the *actio injuriarum* or other non-patrimonial loss, damages do not serve a compensatory function for such loss does not have an economic pecuniary value.
