- 5. Explain how the principles of routinization influence task performance in the contemporary workplace. Give practical examples related to specific work situations in Swaziland.
- 6. Discuss the social consequences of unemployment with specific reference to class, age, and gender. Support your arguments with evidence from the literature.
- 7. State and discuss the assumptions of the unitary framework for analysing conflict in the workplace. What are the major weaknesses of this perspective?
- 8. Provide a comparative analysis of the resource mobilization framework and the situational approach to explaining strike violence in unionized workplaces.
