- 7. With specific examples, discuss the impact of *Robots, Al*, and *Automation* on the social and technical organization of work in the advent of the 4<sup>th</sup> industrial revolution.
- 8. Differentiate between the pluralistic and the radical Marxist approaches to labour relations.
